RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BROWN COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION APPROVING MAJOR AMENDMENT #1 TO THE 2020-2023 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE GREEN BAY URBANIZED AREA

WHEREAS, U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations require the development and annual endorsement of a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for each urbanized area by the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO); and

WHEREAS, In accordance with 23 CFR 450.334(a) the Brown County Planning Commission (BCPC) hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:

- 1. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
- 2. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- 49 U.S.C. 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, and national origin, in employment or business opportunity;
- Sections 1101(b) of the FAST Act (P.L. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in the US DOT funded projects;
- 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CFR Parts 27, 37, and 38;
- The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C 6101), prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- 8. Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities

WHEREAS, the BCPC is the designated MPO for the Green Bay Urbanized Area with responsibility for carrying out an urban transportation planning program; and

WHEREAS, the BCPC Board of Directors is the Green Bay MPO's policy board.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the BCPC Board of Directors approves Major Amendment #1 to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program for the Green Bay Urbanized Area.

NOW, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the MPO planning process is compliant with the requirements of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) and that the BCPC certifies that the urban transportation planning process certification requirements of 23 CFR 450.114 (c) are satisfied.

Amendment Requirement

The Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is required to issue an amendment to the *Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Green Bay Urbanized Area* when any programming or funding changes related to the urbanized area's federally funded road, highway, and public transit projects are proposed. This amendment will be processed as a Major Amendment to the TIP.

Public Comment Period and Public Hearing

MPO staff conducted a 15-day public comment period, and a public hearing was held on November 6, 2019. The public participation documents can be seen in the appendices of this amendment report.

Additions to the 2020-2023 TIP

WisDOT has requested that the following two projects be added to the TIP.

- 1. Design and construction of fencing near the STH 29 / CTH VV Interchange. Design is scheduled for late 2019 and 2020. The construction of the fence will occur in late 2021 and 2022.
- Design and preventative maintenance work on various I-41 ramps between I-43 and STH 45 in Oshkosh. Design is scheduled for late 2019 and 2020. The maintenance work is scheduled for 2026.

Paul Blindauer Chaired tonight's meeting.

Overview and Public Hearing: Draft Major Amendment #1 to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Green Bay Urbanized Area.

- L. Conard provided an overview of the amendment, noting that WisDOT has requested that two projects be added to the program.
 - 1. Design and construction of fencing near the STH 29/CTH VV Interchange.
 - Design and preventative maintenance work on various 1-41 ramps between 1-43 and STH 45 in Oshkosh.
- L. Conard opened up the hearing for comment.
- L. Conard asked three times if anyone wished to speak. Hearing no comment, L. Conard closed the public hearing.
- L. Conard informed the commission that the requirements for a 15-day public review and comment period have been fulfilled, as well as provided the information to the Transportation Subcommittee and have no comments.

Discussion and action regarding the Draft Major Amendment #1 to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Green Bay Urbanized Area.

G. Phal expressed concern that WisDOT may be making a substantial investment on maintenance of select I-41 ramps/facilities (1130-73-00, 71) just prior to the I-41 Expansion project (1130-63-00) in which reconstruction of the same ramps/facilities may occur.

L. Conard noted that this was a good point and that she would forward this concern to WisDOT staff. (WisDOT staff subsequently reported that the I-41 ramp/facilities (1130-73-00, 71) work does not fall within the foot print of the I-41 Expansion project (1130-63-00).)

Question asked if the state has assigned a dollar amount on the work on the Hwy 29 VV interchange.

L. Conard stated the project in its entirety is estimated at 32 million dollars. The proposed addition to the TIP includes the design work for the installation of a fence at \$48,000 (federal) and \$12,000 (state). The actual installation of the fence is estimated to be about 1.4 million dollars with a federal grant covering approximately 75% and the state covering 25%. No local money is being used for the fencing portion of the project.

A motion was made by G. Pahl, seconded by D. Juengst, to approve the Draft Major Amendment #1 to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Green Bay Urbanized Area. Motion carried unanimously.

A MPO Policy Board member expressed concern that WisDOT may be making a substantial investment on maintenance of select I-41 ramps/facilities (1130-73-00, 71) just prior to the I-41 Expansion project (1130-63-00) in which reconstruction of the same ramps/facilities may occur.
